We are an Active School






Junior Entrepreneur



This programme aims to help children recognise enterprise and entrepreneurship and to foster an awareness and understanding of the entrepreneur's role in the community therefore empowering the child to start to think and act with the initiative, creativity, independence and ideas that are invaluable in the modern world. During the last few weeks the girls have worked collaboratively in small groups, in order to generate a range of potential entrepreneurship project ideas. No Mow May!






