Christmas Cards Fundraiser.



Cycle Training in St. Joseph's

Cycle Skills Training.

St. Joseph's are staging a course in cycling skills training during the month of November. This course is aligned to Sprocket Rocket, Cycling Ireland's fun skills cycling programme. We are delighted to welcome back trainer Ulick O'Beirne. This year the cycle training is timetabled to girls in First, Second and Third Classes. The programme is aimed at teaching children the four fundamental cycling skills of Balance, Pedalling, Braking and Cornering. Providing a strong cycling skill foundation for young cyclists. Skill development, including general cycling skills which will lay the foundation for more advanced learning of specific cycling skills in the future. Fostering enjoyment and 'want' of participation. Teaching cyclist's fair-play and rules at their level, rather than promoting a win at all cost attitude. The programme will consist of 5 sessions with each session lasting 40 minutes in length. At the end of the course, each trainee will receive a certificate of completion. However the cycle skills training is weather dependent so we hope for dry days.
