

Therefore all classes will trial this initiative after mid-term.




Fun Activities in St. Joseph's

Internet Safety.

On Tuesday 10th of October we welcomed a 'Zeeko' presenter to speak to the girls from third to Sixth class on how best to navigate internet usage and online safety. Zeeko Education recommend a community based approach to reduce risks so both Staff members and Parents were made aware and given a greater understanding of the issues and opportunities facing children online. Some of the issues addressed included Cyber-bullying, Inappropriate Content, Stranger Danger, Digital Footprint and Social Media/ Excessive Internet Usage. The girls engaged very well with the presenter and we hope that we are all empowered following this presentation. As our midterm approaches and the girls will have more opportunities to spend on their devices we might all remember one important rule.

STOP, BLOCK, TELL.

Reinforce the risk of strangers online, Encourage the girls to block strangers, Emphasise the importance of accounts on private and to ensure that you tell an adult immediately.



Camogie Blitz in Ardfield.


